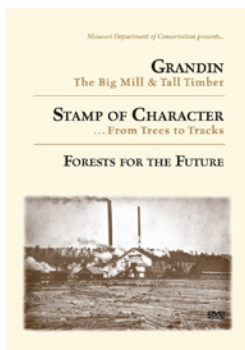


THE PROMISE CONTINUES

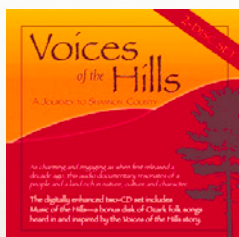

This audio documentary resonates of a story of people and land rich in nature, culture, and character. It includes Ozark folk songs inspired by the stories.

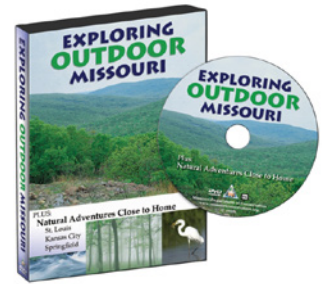

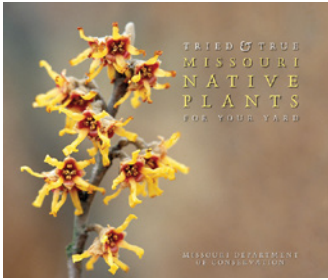
SEEDLING ID GUIDE FOR NATIVE PRAIRIE PLANTS

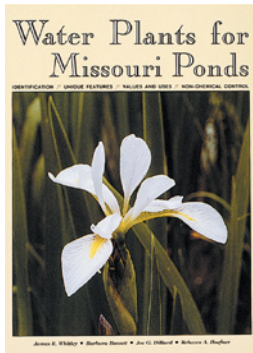

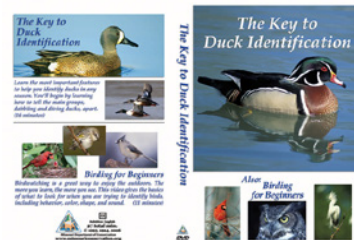

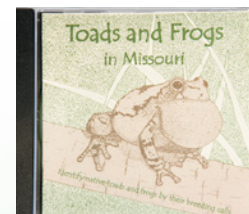
